

DNEWS Premieres Documentary on Hamas Terrorist Attack at Supernova Music Festival

On Thursday, March 7 at 10 p.m., the DIRECTV news channel will air "Supernova: The Music Festival Massacre," a documentary that offers a harrowing and detailed account of the massacre carried out by Hamas at an electronic music festival last October 7 in Israel.

Buenos Aires, March 2024 — DNEWS, the first live Latin American news channel for Latin America and the world, premieres the documentary **Supernova: The Music Festival Massacre**, on Thursday, March 7 at 10 p.m. (Argentina time), on DIRECTV channels 700 and 1700 HD and on its live TV and streaming platform <u>DGO</u>.

The massacre at the Supernova festival in the Negev Desert marked a historic turning point for Israel: on October 7, 2023 at 6:30 a.m., Hamas terrorists crossed the borders from Gaza into Israel, launching a planned and coordinated attack.

Among their targets was an annual techno music festival that was attended by more than 3,500 young people. Within minutes, the festival grounds became a scene of horror: more than 370 people were brutally killed, hundreds were wounded and 40 were kidnapped and taken hostage.

The attack on the Re'im festival was one of Hamas' first targets and the beginning of the war that continues to this day.

In the moving film to be aired by **DNEWS**, survivors and first responders tell their stories and the horrors they witnessed. Filmed just days after the events, their trauma is evident, their grief over the loss of friends and family is palpable and their continued fear is visible.

The attacks were documented in real time and, for the first time, by both the perpetrators and the victims. Meticulously collected materials from dozens of sources, including Hamas' own cameramen, survivors' smartphones, footage from surveillance systems and first responders on the scene were used, providing unprecedented information about the massacre.

Supernova: The Music Festival Massacre airs on March 7 at 10 p.m. (Argentina, Chile and Uruguay) and 8 p.m. (Ecuador, Peru and Colombia) on DNEWS, available on DIRECTV channels 700 and 1700 HD. The program will be aired again on Saturday 9 and Sunday 10 at the same hour.
